Between the Testaments (Part 1)

'History is His Story' is a famous quote. C. S. Lewis says 'History is the story written by the finger of God'. The marvel of the Bible is that it unfolds world history in a beautiful unique way that connects the God of heaven and earth and human beings who were led, taught and blessed by the God of heaven and earth.

In this sequence of historical events, there are about 400 years called the 'Silent years' in which lie unspoken and often unheard events between the end of the Old Testament and the beginning of the New Testament. They are called 'Silent years' because there was no message from God through a prophet of God during these years. Here is a very brief summary of the events between Malachi and Matthew which teach us some very valuable lessons. The years of 'Silence' are between 430 B.C and 63 B.C (approximate years)

430 B.C – This is the time when Malachi spoke his words of warning and encouragement to the people of Israel after they had returned from exile. His message was about honouring God in the temple and through their giving to the Lord. During this time the Medo-Persian kingdom was ruling over Israel. Isaiah 45:1-3 says Thus says the Lord to His anointed, to Cyrus, whose right hand I have held to subdue nations before him and loose the armour of kings, to open before him the double doors, so that the gates will not be shut: I will go before you and make the crooked places straight; I will break in pieces the gates of bronze and cut the bars of iron. I will give you the treasures of darkness and hidden riches of secret places, that you may know that I, the Lord, who call you by your name, am the God of Israel. God used King Cyrus to send those who were willing to return to Israel and also sent the temple vessels. The Persian Kingdom lasted from 539-332 B.C.

Alexander the Great – One of the greatest conquerors of the world ruled in this time and Israel was also part of his kingdom. He gave the freedom for people to follow their own religions. This kingdom lasted from 332-323 B.C.

Ptolemy – Ptolemy Soter was a companion of Alexander the Great and when Alexader died at the young age of 33, Ptolemy, like the

other generals under Alexander, took over various nations. Ptolemy ruled over Egypt and Israel. This kingdom lasted from 323-198 B.C. This was followed by the Syrian kingdom from 198-168 B.C.

Maccabean Revolt – This is another significant time in the history of Israel because there is a special historic event that happened which also be repeated in the End Times. The mention of the prophecy is found in Daniel 9:27 which says, 'Then he shall confirm a covenant with many for one week; But in the middle of the week, He shall bring an end to sacrifice and offering. And on the wing of abominations shall be one who makes desolate, even until the consummation, which is determined, is poured out on the desolate.' There was a desecration of the Jerusalem temple around 165 B.C. and the Jews stood in one accord against the Seleucid Empire. History will repeat itself during the Tribulation period after the Rapture when the antichrist will go into the temple and declare that he is God.

Roman Empire – Around 65 B.C the Romans captured various nations and one of them was the nation of Israel. It was during this empire that the first advent happened and the Messiah was born in Jerusalem.

While the significance of the above events will not mean much in itself, we will see in my Part - 2 how there were heretical, apocryphal writings that came which has permeated into teachings that exist today both in Catholic theology and even in other religions. My final note of warning: If we are not careful to embrace God and His truth fully and exclusively, satan can and will penetrate our minds and hearts the way he did in history.

Medical Corner

Allergy in the Body - I Food Allergy

"Doctors treat, but Jesus heals"

Many of us are allergic to certain type of food. Up to 20% of the population perceive themselves as suffering from food allergy but only 1-2% of adults have geniue food allergies. The most common culprits are peanuts, milk, egg, soya, wheat, shellfish, shrimps, crabs, lobster, clams, oysters, mussels, and certain fruits and vegetables. Some children are born lactose intolerant.

Clinical manifestations occur immediately on exposure and range from trivial to life- threatening or even fatal anaphylaxis. In the 'oral allergy syndrome" contact with certain fresh fruit juices results in urticaria (rashes) and angio - oedema of the lips, mouth, and throat'. Other symptoms could be nausea, vomiting , diarrhea, asthma, bronchitis, hoarseness of voice and sometimes cardiovascular and respiratory collapse. Fatal reaction to trace amounts of peanuts are well documented.

The suspect allergen can be confirmed by medical history , physical examination, range of blood tests, skin prick tests and measurements of antigen- specific antibodies in serum have limited predictive value. In many cases clinical suspicion and trials of elimination diets are used.

When a child is diagnosed with a food allergy, it is mandatory for the child to completely avoid it and all products made from it. If you are allergic to gluten look for gluten-free baking powder. Use Wheat-free pasta varieties instead. If your child is diagnosed as milk tolerant, consider soy milk. Egg, like milk may be hidden ingredient in many foods such as fried foods served at restaurants, ice creams and

desserts. The tough part is, telling which food may have hidden ingredients you are allergic to. So it is better to eat home cooked food.

Treatment of proven food allergy consists of detailed patient education and awareness, strict elimination of the offending antigen (food) and in some cases antihistamines or sodium cromoglicate. Anaphylaxis should be treated as a medical emergency with resuscitation, airway support and intravenous adrenaline (epinephrine). Patients should wear an information bracelet. Living with an allergy is no longer as difficult as it was. With the availability of many food options, you can steer clear of the symptoms.
